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I. INFORMATION PACKAGE

Design Services for McElhaney Road Solicitation Identification Number PD 20-21.067

Purpose:

On September 16, 2020, Hurricane Sally made landfall as a Category 2 storm in Gulf Shores, Alabama. Because Escambia County, Florida is on the east side of, and directly adjacent to, the landfall location, significant damages to the existing infrastructure occurred. As a result of these damages, Escambia County is requesting engineering services to design and implement the repair of these damages, consistent with the requirements for FEMA reimbursement.

Background

The Construction Management Division of Escambia County Engineering Department requests construction plans be developed for the McElhaney Road Stormwater Culvert System Repairs FEMA project. Two sets of Construction plans will be included in the design. First, the design for the “In-Kind” repairs of the existing stormwater cross drains and second, the design for Hazard Mitigation of the existing stormwater cross drains at 7200 McElhaney Road and 8000 McElhaney Road. Included in both sets of plans, A&E services shall provide construction plans, a hydraulic analysis, permitting, public involvement (if required), bid documents, bid assistance, and full project construction oversight for the McElhaney Road Stormwater Culvert System Repairs Project. The Repair “In-Kind” design shall be consistent with FEMA PW requirements and address updates required by current Codes and Standards (Such as ADA). The Hazard Mitigation will provide a proposal for the project consistent with FEMA cost ratio requirements. A&E will also assist Escambia County Engineering Department in lobbying on the need for Hazard Mitigation repair.

The Project goals and objectives are as followed:

1. “In-Kind”:
 - a. Repair “In-Kind” the damages that occurred to the existing cross drains, located at 7200 McElhaney Road and 8000 McElhaney Road, and any other items that were impacted by the storm event. This includes any updates/upgrades required by Codes & Standards.
2. Hazard Mitigation:
 - b. Perform a hydraulic analysis to mitigate the damages that occurred to the cross drains at 7200 McElhaney Road and 8000 McElhaney Road, and any

other items that were impacted by the storm event to prevent future damages.

- c. Extend the stormwater culvert system at 7200 McElhaney Road to the existing southern Right-of-Way to prevent further damages to the drainage infrastructure.
3. "In-Kind" & Hazard Mitigation:
- d. The A/E will be responsible for acquiring the certified Boundary and Topographic Survey that meets the current Florida Minimum Technical Standards as set forth by the Board of Professional Surveyors and Mappers.

Scope of Work

Task 1 - Data Collection & Review:

The consultants and/or its sub-consultants will perform the following activities in completing the "In-Kind" construction plans:

Surveying services necessary for the design of the project shall be created based upon, but not limited to, the following:

- Five certified copies of a Topographical Survey that meets the current Florida Minimum Technical Standards as set forth by the Board of Professional Surveyors and Mappers.
- Minimum of two Benchmarks referenced to NAVD 1988 Datum. Maximum distance between Benchmarks shall not to exceed 1000 feet.
- Cross-section data intervals shall not exceed 100 feet. Where possible, topographical data shall exceed the right-of-way width by a minimum of 15 feet to ensure complete DTM coverage of right-of-way.
- Road rights-of-way and parcel lines depicted on topographical survey shall be based on field located property corners, where such corners exist. If property line data is acquired from the Escambia County Property Appraiser, a note shall be placed on the survey that these lines are approximate.
- Electronic files submitted shall be based on State Plane Coordinates, NAD 83/90, and North Florida Zone.
- Prepare R/W acquisition map, legal and sketches of acquisitions and

any easements that are needed stake R/W and Easements that are being acquired.

The consultants and/or its sub-consultants will perform the following activities in completing the Hazard Mitigation construction plans, in addition to the above listed (1.1) activities:

1.2 Additional data collection

- Meet with Engineering Department staff for input or maintenance and historical complaints.
- Provide Geotechnical Reports on Soil Data
- Attend public meetings with residents to receive input from the residents regarding drainage and paving issues.

Task 2 - Plan Preparation, and Permitting:

The consultants and/or its sub-consultants will perform the following activities in completing Both, "In-Kind" and Hazard Mitigation construction plans:

- Attend public meetings with residents to receive input from the residents regarding drainage and paving issues.
- Meet with Engineering Department staff for input or maintenance and historical complaints.
- Provide Geotechnical Reports on Soil Data
- Coordinate with County Surveyor and staff for the collection of surveying data for project.
- Provide 30%, 60%, 90%, and final plans for each project phase for review by County, and FDOT when applicable.
- Provide for all required regulatory permitting, including permit fee allowances.
- Plans should be reproducible to 40 scale on 11"x17" and 20 scale on 24" X 36" sheets size plans.
- Utility Coordination and Plans-in-hand walk through with Utility companies at all phase submittals.
- Submit cost estimates via pricing agreement (preliminary at 60%, final draft at 90%, Final Pricing Agreement or Bid Tab Sheet at 100%).

Task 3 - Bidding Estimates:

The consultants and/or its sub-consultants will perform the following activities in completing Both, "In-Kind" and Hazard Mitigation construction plans:

- Prepare all bid documents through bidding process.
- Attend pre-bid meeting with Engineering and Purchasing Departments.
- Respond to all Request for Information and issue any necessary addendums.
- Tabulate bids or pricing agreement totals.

Task 4 - Post Design Services (Limited Allowance Based upon actual time):

The consultants and/or its sub-consultants will perform the following activities in completing Both, “In-Kind” and Hazard Mitigation construction plans:

- Verify all control points utilized for survey are still in place. If they have been disturbed, replace as appropriate.
- Consultant will attend a Preconstruction Conference.
- Provide geotechnical support as needed for situations that arise during construction.
- Consultant will prepare as-built certification based upon contractor mark-ups & post construction meetings and inspections.
- Consultant will be available on an as-needed basis during construction to address issues with design or any unforeseen construction issues. and as needed to monitor construction and prepare as-built drawings. The County, or CEI, will inspect all construction improvements. All post services provided by the consultant shall be established as an allowance.

Desired FEMA Project Timeline:

Design time frame: 3 months (90 days) for all project design and permitting.

Construction time frame: One year and one month (including 3 months bidding assistance, and 1 month as-builts and closeout)

Total Contract time: The initial contract time will be 16 months (1 year 4 months)

Design Criteria:

General Specifications: Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction, (Current Edition) and supplements as amended, and the latest Escambia County Technical Specifications.

Firms desiring to provide described Professional Services shall submit one (1) electronic copy of your firms Letter of Interest containing all of the requested information no later than the date and time listed on the cover sheet. Submittals delivered late shall not be accepted or considered. No exceptions will be made.

All information requested must be submitted. Failure to submit all information may result in a lower evaluation of the proposal. Letters, which are substantially incomplete or lack key information, may be rejected by the County at its discretion. The selection of the short-listed firms will be based on the information provided in the submittal.

The submittals shall be in the GSA Standard Form (SF) 330 format with one additional section as described below (include in Letter of Interest). No other format will be acceptable.

Information submitted with your letter of interest should include documentation to demonstrate your firm's qualifications and abilities to provide the scope of services. The submittal should include sufficient information to permit a clear understanding of similar past projects, especially in Florida, staff experience and abilities, and any other additional, pertinent details to describe the team's capabilities.

A committee will review the information submitted and short-list the firms. On-site presentations, interviews, and or discussions will be requested of a short list of three or more firms. Once all review is complete, the short-listed firms will be ranked by the selection committee with the top ranked firm being scheduled for negotiations.

The following policy will apply to all methods of source selection:

B. CONDUCT OF PARTICIPANTS

After the issuance of any solicitation, all bidders/proposers/protestors or individuals acting on their behalf are hereby prohibited from **lobbying** as defined herein or otherwise attempting to persuade or influence any elected County officials, their agents or employees or any member of the relevant selection committee at any time during the **blackout period** as defined herein; provided, however, nothing herein shall prohibit bidders/proposers/protestors or individuals acting on their behalf from communicating with the purchasing staff concerning a pending solicitation unless otherwise provided for in the solicitation or unless otherwise directed by the purchasing manager.

Definitions

Blackout period means the period between the time the bids/proposals for invitations for bid or the request for proposal, or qualifications, or information, or requests for letters of interest, or the invitation to negotiate, as applicable, are received at the Escambia County Office of Purchasing and the time the Board awards the contract, and any resulting bid protest is resolved, or the solicitation is otherwise canceled.

Lobbying means the attempt to influence the thinking of elected County officials, their agents or employees or any member of the relevant Selection Committee for or against

a specific cause related to a pending solicitation for goods or services, in person, by mail, by facsimile, by telephone, by electronic mail, or by any other means of communication.

Sanctions

The Board may impose any one or more of the following sanctions on a nonemployee for violations of the policy set forth herein:

- a. Rejection/disqualification of submittal
- b. Termination of contracts; or
- c. Suspension or debarment as provided in Sec. 46-102 of the Escambia County Code of Ordinances.

This policy is not intended to alter the procedure for Protested Solicitations and Awards as set forth in the Sec. 46-101 of the Escambia County Code of Ordinances.

C. IDENTIFICATION OF SUBCONSULTANTS/CHANGES AFTER THE FACT

After delivering an initial proposal in response to this solicitation, all submitters are prohibited from substituting, modifying, or amending those subconsultants identified in the initial written submittal at any time during the course of the solicitation process up to the final award of contract and including question and answer sessions, presentations or technical clarifications and submittals as may be required by the Review/Selection Committee. A substitution or addition of subconsultants or any other material changes to the submittal after the initial response will cause the submittal to be invalid for review and selection purposes.
