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I. INFORMATION PACKAGE

SCOPE OF WORK LIMITED CONSTRUCTION, ENGINEERING, AND INSPECTION FOR THE LONGLEAF DR BRIDGE REPLACEMENT

SCOPE OF SERVICES SUMMARY

The Scope of Work for this project is to provide limited construction, engineering, inspection and project administrative services for the bridge replacement portion for the following portion of the project: LONGLEAF DRIVE BRIDGE REPLACEMENT. This document gives the Consultant the same responsibility as Escambia County when administering this County construction project contracts. The administration of the bridge installation in the LONGLEAF DRIVE BRIDGE REPLACEMENT will be conducted by the Consultant in full cooperation with Escambia County. Escambia County will have the final word in regard to challenges of Consultant authority by the contractor or decisions made by the Consultant regarding the work. The goal of Escambia County and the Consultant should be to administer the contract in a highly professional manner, conducive to a cooperative relationship between the Consultant, Contractors, and Escambia County, and to complete the work on budget and on time with minimum inconvenience and maximum safety for the public.

The responsibilities of the Consultant on this project are, but not limited to:

- 1. Erosion Control Conference:** Prepare for and conduct an Erosion Control Conference. Address and resolve all issues that arise at the meetings with appropriate offices, agencies and divisions in regard to the bridge installation. Prepare and distribute detailed minutes of the meeting. The Escambia County Project Coordinator (PC) will schedule the meeting and provide the time/place to the inspection personnel.
- 2. Attend Bi-Weekly Meetings:** Prepare the agenda, attend, and conduct a meeting every other week (or as needed) with Escambia County personnel, Contractor, Sub-Contractors, Utility personnel and other agencies affected by the project during the bridge installation. Be prepared to discuss recent progress, upcoming events, the schedule, and problems associated with the bridge related portion of the project. Record significant information revealed and discussed at the meeting. Distribute written minutes to the appropriate agencies. The Escambia County Project Coordinator will provide updated construction schedule to inspection personnel for the project.
- 3. Project Administration:** Provide project administration and coordinate with the assigned Project Coordinator for the bridge installation. Prepare for, cooperate with, and assist auditors who may be assigned to review project records, payments, reports, etc. Provide ample inspectors and assistance to adequately oversee all work being done on the contract. Monitor contractor's hours worked and materials on the project and verify all pay requests for accuracy. Prior to starting work, submit to Project Coordinator a listing of personnel assigned to the project for review and approval. In addition, a list of persons with emergency phone numbers should always be supplied to the Project Coordinator and be available at any time in the case of an emergency on the project. The Consultant should also obtain from the Contractor a list of personnel that will be responsible for any occurrence that may arise on the project, for the life of the project.

4. Provide Bridge Construction Inspection: Provide effective and qualified supervision of all inspection services being conducted by Prime Contractor and Sub-Contractors. All field technicians must be certified as required by the Escambia County Technical Specifications for the types of work to be performed including training certifications/records as applicable. In accordance with the construction plans of the bridge portion of the project, the PDA, pile capacities, pile driving criteria, foundation design, and vibration monitoring requirements are established by the County Consultant's Engineer of Record (EOR) Geotechnical Engineer or the bridge manufacturer's Geotechnical Engineer.

- Review Contractor's Pile Installation Plan and provide comments to the Project Engineer and to the PM within five (5) working days of the Contractor's submittal.
- Perform Wave Equation Analysis for Piles (WEAP) to determine suitability of hammer driving system for the project. Provide results (check stresses, design capacity, and ultimate capacity) to the PM within five (5) working days of the Contractor's submittal.
- Ensure dynamic testing performed (per the contract documents and when deemed necessary by the PM) during initial driving and re-drives.
- Furnish final written letters, signed and sealed, in the agreed format for production pile lengths and the driving criteria. The driving criteria letter must include blow count criteria, special requirements and limitations on settings (strokes/energy) to limit the stresses per the Specifications. Include recommendations as to what to consider firm driving when applicable, to obtain the required minimum penetration.
- Provide recommendations for additional or intermediate piles when production piles fail to meet load criteria when driven to maximum production depth, as needed to achieve the EOR or Bridge Manufacturers minimum footer load requirements.

5. Conduct Field Surveys (if needed): Verify surveying services to obtain original, final, as well as progress estimate quantities for payment of all critical backfill earthwork pay items to the Contractor for the bridge installation. Be prepared to justify quantities in case of discrepancies between the Contractors and Project Coordinator. Upon request, check construction layout when deemed necessary by the Project Coordinator.

6. Supplemental Agreements/Construction Changes: Notify the Project Coordinator of the necessity of any Supplemental Agreements/Construction Changes. Negotiate prices for additional pay items with the Contractor while adhering to the "Average Unit Price" listing when possible. Coordinate acceptance of prices with the Project Coordinator.

8. Quality Assurance, Testing for Acceptance, and Training (as applicable): Copies of all certifications should be filed in the project records for review by Escambia County at any time. Any temporary waivers of certification or licensing will be reviewed by Escambia County for the final decision. Provide certification training to consultant personnel for all necessary field-testing and inspection. Monitor the testing provided by the Contractor in the field as defined in the Contract, Plans or Specifications. Document Consultant testing on standard forms provided by Escambia County and distribute as required. Monitor documentation of testing by the Contractor. Field test verification by the Consultant includes, but is not limited to, all asphalt related testing to include asphalt plant inspection and all concrete related testing for acceptance by Escambia County, nuclear density testing of earthwork, base stone, asphalt, structural (critical) backfill and pipe backfill as defined in the Escambia County Technical Specifications and Escambia County's sampling and testing schedule or as otherwise provided in the plans. (Note: All tests normally performed by Escambia County personnel will be performed by the Consultant.) Also, Consultant's responsibilities include the random checking of application rates, dimensions and bearings to

assure conformance to the Plans and Specifications. In case of notification of defective concrete as defined in the Specifications, the Consultant will submit the initial information on forms supplied by Escambia County and will receive the final disposition of the material after review. Certifications of material submitted by the Contractor will be reviewed by the Consultant for conformity to the Project Specifications. The certification documents submitted to Escambia County will also be reviewed for completeness and conformance to the Escambia County's standard form of submission. A Final Materials and Tests Certification will be submitted to Project Coordinator with the Final Records.

9. Progress Payments: The Consultant will document and assemble accurate quantities for Monthly Progress Payments to the Prime Contractor from actual project field records, as directed by Special Provisions in the contract, from Supplemental Agreements/Construction Changes. The quantities for payment will be referenced to field records prior to submission for payment. Test reports will be on file prior to payment. The Project Coordinator must approve any waiver of testing documents prior to payment. Pay quantities will be submitted to the Project Coordinator for review and payment. Payments for stockpiled material may be made as defined in the Escambia County Technical Specifications and approved by the Project Coordinator. Copies of approved Sub Contractors should be on file prior to the first Progress Payment.

10. Revisions to the Contract Plans: Any revisions to the contract plans or cross sections will be submitted to the Project Coordinator for review and processing.

11. Distribution of Correspondence: Submit to the Project Coordinator a copy of all correspondence between the Consultant, Contractor, Sub Contractors, EOR or others concerning matters related to the project. Maintain an electronic file of all correspondence for submission with the project Final Records.

12. Inspection of Work (as applicable): Provide limited inspection services for conformance to Plans and Specifications for the footing, bridge structure, critical backfill and associated items (including utilities over or attached to the bridge) that are being incorporated into the bridge portion of the project. Observe, measure and record all quantities required for payment. Record field measurements in project records for review by Escambia County or auditors. The records will be recorded on a standard form (field book) supplied or defined by Escambia County and/or on field inspection forms to be submitted to Escambia County. Check traffic control daily, and additionally as required or requested. Notify the contractor of deficiencies or problems immediately. Document weekly (or as often as required) project traffic control on forms supplied by Escambia County and distribute as required. Inspect daily erosion control items for conformance to the plans as well as effectiveness in the field. Notify the contractor of deficiencies. Prepare to justify any and all pay quantities in the case of questions from the contractor or Escambia County. Prepare an accurate daily diary, signed by the inspector, consisting of, but not limited to:

- A record of the contractors on the project
- Their personnel (number and classification)
- Equipment (number and type or size) arriving to or leaving the project, idle equipment
- Location and work performed by each Contractor or Subcontractor
- Orders given to the Contractor
- Events of note on the project
- Accidents on the project and any details surrounding the accident such as police report number, fatalities, causes, time, etc. Obtain a copy of the police report for the project records whenever possible.
- Weather, amount of precipitation, temperature at morning, noon, and evening, cloudy, clear, etc.

- Days charged, with explanation if not charged
- Any other details that may be important later in the project life to verify the work performed:
 - Detailed notes of work locations and days onsite.
 - A digital video of the site/areas where work is to be performed prior to construction.
 - Photo documentation of work areas before, during, and after construction.
 - Backup for material hauled away from the site, including type of materials, size of the load, and final disposal site location.
 - Documentation of load tickets and material purchase.
 - Field Measurements to verify quantities of work both before and after work is performed. Major discrepancies should be coordinated with the County/Engineer prior to work being performed.
 - Any other documentation which provides a way for the CEI to verify the quantities of work performed.

13. Reports: There are numerous reports, documents, etc., that shall be generated in the process of Contract Administration. Submit a formatted (Escambia County standard format) of selected project records to Project Coordinator after project completion. Any questions regarding the requirements shall be forwarded to the Project Coordinator for clarification.

14. Final Records: Submit a final estimate (electronic format) for the project at this time. Coordinate Consultant hours after project completion with the Project Coordinator for approval.

15. Project Claims: Prepare documentation and assist in the defense of Escambia County, when requested, in preparation for Claims or possible Claims resulting in the execution of the contract.

16. Utilities: Utility relocations are included in this contract. The CEI should ensure that the Contractor follows Sunshine One protocol before digging.

17. Plan Review: Review submitted shop drawings from the design engineers prior to construction for completion, comments, concerns and observations.

18. Citizen Interface: Consultant will act as primary point of contact for citizen comments, inquiries and complaints for the bridge portion of this construction project.

19. OTHER SERVICES:

Upon written request, the Consultant will perform additional services for the project not otherwise identified in this Agreement. The following items are not included as part of this Agreement but may be required by the County to supplement the Consultant services under this Agreement.

- Assist in preparing for arbitration hearings or litigation that occurs during the Agreement time in connection with the construction project covered by this Agreement.
- Provide qualified engineering witnesses and exhibits for arbitration hearings or litigation in connection with the Agreement.
- Provide bridge inspection services in addition to those provided for in this Agreement including vibration monitoring supervision
- Provide services determined necessary for the successful completion and closure of the Bridge Construction portion of the contract.

Project Coordinators' preference:

Note:

The County desires the CEI contract not to exceed 7% of the estimated construction cost of the bridge portion of the project. Required hours and total Fee will be negotiated. The consultant should prepare the proposal estimated upon full time onsite inspections during bridge construction activities. Inspector must be CTQP certified. MOT certification is also required. The contract shall be "Not To Exceed" based upon hourly rates. If additional hours are required beyond the "Not to Exceed" amount they will be adjusted through a justified Change Order.

I. INSTRUCTIONS TO SUBMITTERS

Firms desiring to provide described Professional Services shall submit one (1) electronic copy of your firms Letter of Interest containing all of the requested information no later than the date and time listed on the cover sheet. Submittals delivered late shall not be accepted or considered. No exceptions will be made.

All information requested must be submitted. Failure to submit all information may result in a determination of non-responsiveness. Letters, which are substantially incomplete or lack key information, may be rejected by the County at its discretion. The selection of the short-listed firms will be based on the information provided in the submittal.

The submittals shall be in the GSA Standard Form (SF) 330 format with one additional section as described below (include in Letter of Interest). No other format will be acceptable.

Information submitted with your letter of interest should include documentation to demonstrate your firm's qualifications and abilities to provide the scope of services. The submittal should include sufficient information to permit a clear understanding of similar past projects, especially in Florida, staff experience and abilities, and any other additional, pertinent details to describe the team's capabilities.

A committee will review the information submitted and short-list the firms. On-site presentations, interviews, and or discussions will be requested of a short list of three or more firms. Once all review is complete, the short-listed firms will be ranked by the selection committee with the top ranked firm being scheduled for negotiations.

The following policy will apply to all methods of source selection:

B. **CONDUCT OF PARTICIPANTS**

After the issuance of any solicitation, all bidders/proposers/protestors or individuals acting on their behalf are hereby prohibited from **lobbying** as defined herein or otherwise attempting to persuade or influence any elected County officials, their agents or employees or any member of the relevant selection

committee at any time during the **blackout period** as defined herein; provided, however, nothing herein shall prohibit bidders/proposers/protestors or individuals acting on their behalf from communicating with the purchasing staff concerning a pending solicitation unless otherwise provided for in the solicitation or unless otherwise directed by the purchasing manager.

Definitions

Blackout period means the period between the time the bids/proposals for invitations for bid or the request for proposal, or qualifications, or information, or requests for letters of interest, or the invitation to negotiate, as applicable, are received at the Escambia County Office of Purchasing and the time the Board awards the contract, and any resulting bid protest is resolved, or the solicitation is otherwise canceled.

Lobbying means the attempt to influence the thinking of elected County officials, their agents or employees or any member of the relevant Selection Committee for or against a specific cause related to a pending solicitation for goods or services, in person, by mail, by facsimile, by telephone, by electronic mail, or by any other means of communication.

Sanctions

The Board may impose any one or more of the following sanctions on a nonemployee for violations of the policy set forth herein:

- (a) Rejection/disqualification of submittal
- (b) Termination of contracts; or
- (c) Suspension or debarment as provided in Sec. 46-102 of the Escambia County Code of Ordinances.

This policy is not intended to alter the procedure for Protested Solicitations and Awards as set forth in the Sec. 46-101 of the Escambia County Code of Ordinances.

C. IDENTIFICATION OF SUBCONSULTANTS/CHANGES AFTER THE FACT

After delivering an initial proposal in response to this solicitation, all submitters are prohibited from substituting, modifying, or amending those subconsultants identified in the initial written submittal at any time during the course of the solicitation process up to the final award of contract and including question and answer sessions, presentations or technical clarifications and submittals as may be required by the Review/Selection Committee. A substitution or addition of subconsultants or any other material changes to the submittal after the initial response will cause the submittal to be invalid for review and selection purposes.
